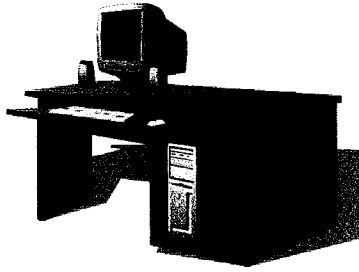
## IRS

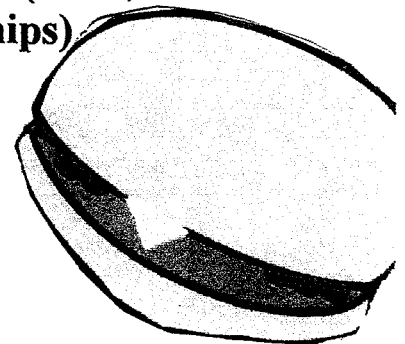
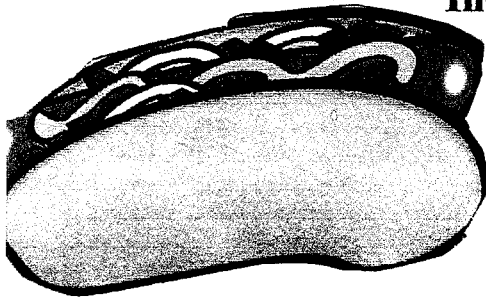
