Nominations were closed and elections will be held on Monday, January 27th. In January the floor will be open again for each of these offices before the election and they will be (write in) candidates.



### **Clubhouse Doors**

There is a major concern regarding our security here in Southfork. We are so close to Us Hwy 98 and anyone can come into the park and go into the clubhouse to rest a bit or use the restroom or as a get a way hideout from the authorities.

Many years ago, some vagrants were found sleeping on the floor of the Cabana Pool area and chased off and the Office door was tampered with and why? Of course, to enter to see if there is any money or important items that can be resold for cash. There has been in this past year vandalism around the Clubhouse and Pool area. Now no one knows if any of these people are armed with any type of a weapon.

There has been on many occasion when a card game is going both afternoons and evenings and have observed many Vendors, UPS, Construction workers that have made their way to the restroom. Now how do they know the clubhouse is even open? Evidently they have used them more often than not. Same goes for the restrooms by the pool. <u>There should be some sort of notice that there are restrooms by the pool area to use for visitors and the clubhouse is for residents use only.</u>

On most days anyone can walk into the clubhouse because it is not locked. It is an understanding that week days from 9 am until 5 pm the doors are open. But, after 5pm and especially on weekends, you can walk into the clubhouse with unlocked doors at any time starting from 7 am on. This is so unsafe and people should stop and think and be safe minded on what could happen here in the hall. LOCK THOSE DOORS!

It does not matter who you are, resident, or maintenance and especially on Saturday or Sunday, lock the doors behind you when you walk out of the Clubhouse even if you know an event is going to be held that day. We have many people who use the Computer in the Library and are sitting there alone with their back to the door and would not know if someone was coming in the door behind them and these same people should lock the door behind them when entering and leaving. When entering the hall and the door is unlocked you assume someone is in there and afraid for fear there is.

SO, PLEASE MAKE SURE TO HAVE YOUR CLUBHOUSE KEY WITH YOU AT ALL TIMES TO ENTER IN CASE IT IS LOCKED AND WHEN YOU LEAVE MAKE SURE AND LOCK UP BEHIND YOU. IF YOU DO NOT HAVE A KEY, ASK TIM OR MEGAN FOR ONE.
