## "Unsung Heroes of Our Community"



I am asking all of you to help out in the recycling of all your aluminum cans. We need them to fund our recycling program which helps pay for HOA activities. We have expanded our aluminum can recycling program and noticed a decline in the can recycling and just wanted you to know, please deposit all of your cans in the areas listed below. *Please, use more aluminum cans and less plastic containers!* 

You can now recycle your aluminum cans at a few different locations here in the park. (1) The Clubhouse, (2) The Pool area, (3) The shuffleboard court area, (4) Pavilion area, (5) The big recycle box in the RV Parking area.

These areas have been installed for all who do not want to make a special trip only to the RV area and with these other areas in the park should make it easier to recycle..







## Facts about Recycling Aluminum

- Americans throw away enough aluminum every month to rebuild our entire commercial air fleet.
- When you throw away an aluminum can you waste as much energy as if you'd filled the can half full of gasoline and poured it into the ground.
- Recycling one aluminum can saves enough energy to run a 100 watt light bulb for 20 hours, a computer for 3 hours, and a TV for 2 hours.
- Even though aluminum is the most valuable recyclable material, aluminum cans still make it to the landfill. Americans throw away nearly \$1 billion worth of aluminum cans each year.
- Recycling aluminum saves energy! Recycling one aluminum can saves enough energy to listen to a full album on an iPod.
- Using standard 12 ounce pop/beer cans, it takes from 32-35 cans to make a pound. There are variances by brand.
- The price paid per pound varies based upon the supply and demand market. Over the past three years the price has ranged from .38 to .28 per pound.
