

News from The HOA Emergency Preparedness Team

Hello fellow residents, and welcome to our new residents! We look forward to meeting all of you and welcome any thoughts or ideas on emergency preparation. Since 'Hurricane Season' begins in June and runs for about six months, emergency preparedness is especially important for all of us.

This month we will try a different format for our monthly article. We thank those who have given us feedback and made suggestions. Please keep this up and contact any members of the Team listed at the end of this article. Here are some updates:

◆ Emergency Preparedness During This Difficult Time:

As we have noted in previous articles, and, as everyone knows, the time to prepare is before a crisis. Today we find ourselves in a situation for which there was no way to prepare. Everyone is struggling, as the government tries to control the spread of the virus while developing a vaccine or cure. Sometimes, like **NOW**, with our activities restricted, it is difficult to do much specific planning. We can, however, work on things individually, and the Team will be working on strengthening the zone organization we created last year, recruiting new members, setting goals for ourselves, and preparing in a very general way not only for virus related matters, but for the upcoming hurricane season. We hope and pray that things improve soon.

♦ Household Inventory List Now Available:

Are you looking for things to do? Are you tired of cleaning out your storage area? Are you tired of planting flowers, trees, and bushes? Have you finished your painting and your fix up projects? If you are looking for something different to do, our Team has a great suggestion. Now would be a great time to put together a **Household Inventory List**. Last year the Team included a copy of a form in the information packets we distributed.

The old folded, legal-size form has been replaced by a new, sleek, more efficient one-page form. The Team thanks member Dave Rawson for coming up with an excellent alternative to the old form. This new form has been included in this issue. There are spaces for the value and date of purchase for many items, room by room, and space to add additional items. If you need more space, use the back of the form.

The Team recommends that you take pictures and/or videos of these items and save them for future reference. This process is beneficial for many reasons, not just preparing for hurricanes. It can be useful when an owner needs to file an insurance claim for some type of loss. This could be damage from broken pipes, from fire, flood, or by theft. People may have jewelry or other items of value that should be included and protected. If you have questions about specific items that may need additional coverage, be sure to ask your insurance agent. This is a good time to make that call.

Having this information readily available at your fingertips will help you deal with problems in the event of a hurricane or other disaster. When something happens, you will be awfully glad that you took the time to do this. If you are filing a claim for an item that is rare or valuable, for example, a baseball signed by Babe Ruth which you claim is worth \$ 5,000, it will really help to have your photos and videos ready to show the insurance people. The same thing applies to other items of value. Your insurance agent will also be happy as it makes her / his job easier. So, put aside an hour or two and get it done!

♦ Hurricane Lights Available to New Residents and Others Who Did Not Receive Them Last Year:

The Team still has several **Hurricane Lights** available (free of charge, of course, batteries included). These were donated last year by Spectrum Bay News 9. These small battery-operated lights have three settings and are especially useful.f

◆ Team Update – Next Steps:

In the past two years the Team met regularly to do planning and preparation. By this time, we had hoped to be putting together information packets for all residents and scheduling a Special Meeting for early June. Last year we had Jeri Kaplan of the Polk Emergency Office as our primary speaker. This year we had been in touch with her early on, before this crisis arose, and she indicated she would be happy to participate this year. We also thought about expanding the scope of the meeting to include other officials, some Fire Rescue people, some Haines City representatives, etc. It might be a good chance for some of the local officials / commissioners / city management people, to see our beautiful community and begin to build a relationship with us.

This virus has disrupted our lives in many ways, and the Team has been unable to meet and plan. The Team plans to be in touch with each other through e-mail and phone to update our **Zone Coverage Plan**. We have reviewed this in previous articles. Last year we had eight zones and a coordinator in each zone. This year we hope to continue this. We will be asking the coordinators to try to recruit others in the zone to help.

Finally, the Team wishes all of you the best in this difficult time. We are all about neighbors helping neighbors, and the Team is here to help in any way we can. Below is a current list of our members for 2020. If anyone is interested in helping, contact any of our members.
