Veteran's Corner

This month's Southfork Veteran in the spotlight is PJ Williams.



United States Navy, 1967-1971



United States Army, 1974-1978

PJ grew up in Appleton, Wisconsin. As was the experience of most young men of the Viet Nam era, PJ chose to join the Navy rather than wait to be drafted. After completion of Basic Training, he attended Quartermaster (QM) school in Newport, Rhode Island, graduating at the top of his class. He was assigned to the USS Deliver, ARS-23, a salvage and rescue ship. Unfortunately, there were questions about where the ship was so PJ chased the ship from the Philippines to Perth Australia then Hong Kong, eventually finding the ship in Taiwan! What an adventure for a young man straight out of the Midwest. After three years on the ship, PJ decided the Navy wasn't for him and headed home to civilian life. He worked numerous jobs, including Disney World before getting the itch to return to the service of his country. The Army was more than accommodating so in 1974 he shipped out to Ft. Leonard Wood, Missouri followed by training at Ft. Gordon in Georgia where he learned to copy Morse Code, again graduating at the top of his class and advancing to Spec 4. Upon completion of training, PJ headed to Germany where he worked at both the 141st and 123rd Signal Battalions. Around that time, he met a pretty, young woman who we all know as "Bert". They had a year long, long distance courtship which culminated in a proposal via mail! (Such a romantic guy!) PJ transferred to Ft. Lewis, near Tacoma, Washington as a Staff Sargent where Bert joined him. Eventually Bert declared "I need the sun!!!" so they decided to leave the Army, but PJ continued supporting the military while working as an Electronic Mechanic and Designer at the Philadelphia Naval Shipyard. He followed that by working with General Dynamics in Chesapeake, Virginia and is still called upon as a consultant for programs deploying UAV's (Unmanned Aerial Vehicles) on Navy Aircraft Carriers. PJ and Bert became residents of Southfork in 2017.

Annual Membership Meeting

The Clubhouse restrictions force us to meet at the Pavilion. Please wear a mask

Our Board of Directors held a brief informal meeting 11/10/2020 confirming the above date and location. All Board Members have agreed to stay on eliminating the need for an election process.

To date we have paid out 65 Ambulance claims.

At present there is no new business to consider, so this should be a short meeting.

<u>Dues</u>: <u>December is our membership renewal month</u>. Please pay by check.. Make it payable to Southfork Ambulance Program, amount of \$12.00 for renewal per year per resident.

New members are always welcome, initial annual fee per person is \$15.00.

<u>Term</u>: A one year agreement, beginning January 1st, thru December 31st. All dues, either new or renewing are due by December 31st. All dues are to be paid before January 1st each year.

<u>Benefit:</u> Most hospitalization plans add a co-pay fee for ambulance service. Our Ambulance Service Program would pay to our user member \$150.00 per usage, limited to two calls per year. Payment is restricted to an Emergency (911) call from anywhere in Pasco County. Example: Heart Failure, Stroke, Falls, Breathing Problems or any EMT determined emergency.

NO FMO NO FS 723 WHY?

- 1. Residents would fall under FS 83, The Landlord and Tenant Act.
- 2. There would be no support for HOAs
- 3. There would be no power to negotiate with park owners
- 4. You could be evicted with a 7-day notice.
- 5. Rents could go up with a 30-day notice every 60 days.

Keep in mind: The FMO is an organization in the State of Florida that monitors and advocates for the rights and interests of manufactured homeowners living on leased land.

Through FMOs involvement, the Florida Manufactured Home Act (Florida Statute 723) was drafted and enacted in 1984. It addresses the relationship between the park owner and homeowners of manufactured homes on leased land. The Florida Legislators recognized that manufactured homeowners AND park owners both have certain basic rights that must be protected.

The FMO and FMHA (parks owners) frequently submits changes to FS 723. FMO has had a huge impact on proposed legislation by opposing harmful proposed changes through negotiations. You may go to Google and type in "FS 723" to receive the latest copy.

FS 723 covers such items as:

- 1. Your Prospectus
- 2. Park Owner's and Homeowner's Obligations
- 3. Rules and Regulations and changes
- 4. HOA and Bylaws
- 5. Dispute settlements
- 6. Evictions, grounds, and proceedings
- 7. Lot Rental Increases
- 8. Reduction of services or utilities
- 9. AND MUCH MORE!

RECYCLING

Glass is not accepted in Southforks Recycling Collections on each Wednesday

Just toss your recyclables into one empty bin and see the list below of what can be recycled! Trash haulers have a 90-day transition period to implement any schedule change.

Since there is no resale market for recycled glass in Florida, and broken glass contaminates the recycling stream – glass will no longer be accepted in our recycling program. Please toss your glass in the trash bin where it will be sent to Pasco's Waste-To-Energy facility, leaving even less of a carbon footprint than it would in a landfill.

"This increase in service is a reflection of Pasco County's commitment to future sustainability and to our citizens," said Solid Waste Director John Power. "Though removing glass may seem counter-intuitive, it increases the overall reuse of collected materials, eases processing and maximizes our positive environmental impact."
