CORONAVIRUS SAFETY

American Red Cross

Follow these easy steps to help prevent the spread of COVID-19.



HOW TO PROTECT YOURSELF AND OTHERS

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after being in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing or sneezing.
- If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.
 - **Avoid close contact** with people who are sick. Some people without symptoms may be able to spread the virus.
- Stay home as much as possible and avoid non-essential travel.
- Practice social distancing by keeping at least 6 feet about two arm lengths away from others if you must go out in public.
- Stay connected with loved ones through video and phone calls, texts and social media.
 - **Cover your mouth and nose** with a cloth face cover when around others and when you must go out in public, such as to a grocery store. The cloth face cover is meant to protect other people in case you are infected.
- However, do NOT place cloth face coverings on young children under age 2, anyone who has trouble breathing, or is unconscious, incapacitated or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance.
- In addition, do NOT use a facemask meant for a health care worker.
- Continue to keep about 6 feet between yourself and others. The cloth face cover is not a substitute for social distancing.

STAY INFORMED

There are many ways of keeping informed here at Southfork Community and it's easy to keep informed with all of them. Here are a few to mention:

- 1. There is a Southfork Phone Directory that is updated constantly with changes, additions or deletions. It contains some useful information, a listing of residents by alpha listing and by street listings with phone numbers and each member of the household can be listed individually if each has their own phone. The phone directory is free to all residents and delivered each December and the cover page list the phone numbers of managers along with their email address. Only Southfork residents see this directory!
- 2. The Southfork News is distributed to each home each month of the year. It contains all the recent announcements and news about all the activities and the community. Please use it for reference throughout the month. The deadline for submitting articles is the 15th of the month and no later and any questions contact Phyllis Grossi at 352-567-6105. I need time to get all the pages together the last couple days before the 15th to make sure I have an even amount of pages which are needed. If you are having problems getting one delivered each month to your home, contact June Sandberg at 763-257-2023.
- 3. If you are on Facebook, search for "<u>you know you are from Southfork when</u>" and LIKE US to become a member. This is a private group and only Southfork can view or post or read any postings. Do not encourage any family members or friends outside of Southfork to try and join the group because they will be declined. This is where any community info between newsletters is posted. It is not to be used like regular facebook with jokes and cartoons and for Southfork info only and anything else will be removed. . <u>Please read the rules before posting.</u>
- 4. The Southfork managers (Tim & Megan) occasionally will send out news regarding the community that must get out and this info is sent out for them by Phyllis Grossi via email and also posted in our Facebook group. That is the only means of getting out info to the entire community as needed besides the newsletter and why emails are needed.
- 5. In addition, there are Bulletin Boards located on the corner of Prairie/Wilds Rd and on the corner of Ewing Dr along with the bulletin board at the clubhouse.

Veteran's Corner

This month's Southfork Veterans are Jim and Dorothy Catron who reside on Mesquite.





Jim grew up in New Castle, Indiana, He joined the Army in 1963 where he was assigned to the Infantry, receiving his initial training at Ft. Gordon, Georgia. In May of 1964 he was detailed to Korea where he served till June of 1965. He spent most of his time in Korea on Guard Duty. He never really fell in love with Korean food, especially Kimchi! His next assignment was Ft. Carson, Colorado where he was assigned duty as a Drill Sgt. By January 1966 Jim was in Ft. Riley, Kansas. During this assignment he led Soldiers in Physical Training, Drills and Weapons training for those who were being sent to Viet Nam. When asked about special memories during his Service in the Army, Jim recalled ending up with a couple of tattoos he got on a dare. In addition, he told me that while on a "ride along" with the Military Police, they were called to a bar fight. Jim thought the guy next to him was pulling a knife on him, so he pushed the guy's arm away. Turns out it was a gun. Jim had been shot and didn't realize it! Thankfully it was not a serious wound! In December of 1966 Jim left the Army and returned to New Castle, Indiana.

Dorothy grew up in Binghamton, New York. She joined the Navy Reserves in 1982. Her best friend's husband was a Navy Recruiter and talked both girls into joining together. She became a Storekeeper (SK) and did her weekend Reserve drills in her hometown. She had opportunities to do two-week training in New Orleans, Orlando and Bethlehem, Maine. While in Maine, Dorothy had an opportunity to go up in a Navy plane only to discover they were going to do "touch and go's". Dorothy also discovered that she gets air sick!!! She left the Naval Reserves in 1988 with an increased sense of self confidence!!

Jim and Dorothy met in March of 2018, moved into Southfork in October of 2018, and married in November of 2018.


Benefits for Blue Water Navy Veterans

DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know what the cheapest but most efficient alarm system everyone has but never thinks of? What to take to bed with you---not a joke, it's actually a pretty neat idea. I bet you never thought of this before.

PUT YOUR CAR KEYS BESIDE YOUR BED AT NIGHT......

If you hear a noise outside your home or someone is trying to get into your house, just press the panic button for your car and call 911. The alarm will be set off and the horn will continue to sound until you turn it off.

This is a signal that will alert all of your neighbors and after making sure you are okay by letting someone know why you turned it on it could be a signal to other neighbors to be on the alert. If all who heard this press their panic button on their keys and turn on all outside lights until the sheriff responds, this prowler or whomever, will be seen by someone and help the police or sheriff when they arrive. After a few seconds all the neighbors will be looking out their windows to see what is going on and I am sure the criminal will not like that.

This tip came from another newsletter article from another community and I thought it would be worth printing here for Southfork. So who cares if you are awakened at night.....for security reasons this should be a must and one of the most least expensive security systems and one that requires no installation.

This would be useful for any type of emergency, such as a person who lives alone and maybe having a heart attack and the keys are right there near you and all you have to do is set that off until someone comes to check on you to call 911. Also great for someone who is working outdoors and falls and carries their keys in their pocket.....set off that button until someone hears it and comes looking.

Remember, it is better to be safe than sorry and we as neighbors have to start looking out for one another and help when help it is needed.
