

Veteran's Corner

This month's Southfork Veteran (for Women's History Month) is Ally Hutto who resides on Ewing.







Ally was born in Batavia, Iowa and was raised in the Ottumwa, Iowa area. While standing in front of the Recruiting Center in St. Paul, MN, she decided she really like the Navy uniform, so Ally joined the Navy in March of 1973. She attended her Basic Training at RTC Orlando, followed by Personnelman (PN) School at NTC Orlando, graduating in June of 1973. Her first set of orders took her to NAS Cecil Field in Jacksonville followed by a tour at Naval Air Reserve Unit, also in Jacksonville. The Navy must have thought Ally loved Jacksonville because her next tour was VP-62 at NAS Jacksonville where she was selected as Sailor of the Year. Her follow-on orders were to Naval Reserve Center, New Orleans. In August of 1980, Ally was in the very first group of Sailors selected for the new Enlisted Commissioning Program (ECP). She attended Auburn University in Alabama for the next two years working on completion of her Bachelor of Science degree with a concentration in Finance. Upon completion of her degree, she attended Officer Candidate School in Newport, Rhode Island. Her first duty station after receiving her commission was Naval Station Guantanamo Bay in Cuba, also known as "Gitmo". This turned out to be the duty station that Ally and her husband enjoyed the most! When she departed Gitmo, she returned to Jacksonville for duty at Naval Manpower, Naval Air Reserve, Personnel Support Detachment, Strike Fighter Wing and Transient Personnel Unit. She retired in 2001 as a Lt Commander. Southfork is her "Northern Home" with her permanent residence in North Fort Myers.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Bang Bang Shrimp (Recipe from Bonefish Grille)

Ingredients:

1 lb shelled shrimp

Cornstarch for coating

Directions:

Coat the shrimp with the cornstarch and fry in a pan with at least an inch of oil. It only takes a few minutes and when golden take the shrimp out (don't over cook) and place a plate with paper towels to absorb the oil.

Dip:

½ cup mayonnaise

1/4 cup Thai mild chili sauce

Mix the two ingredients together until well blended. If you like a little spicier and hot add just a few drops of hot sauce.

This is one delicious appetizer and one for those who love shrimp.

RECYCLING

Glass is not accepted in Southforks Recycling Collections on each Wednesday

Just toss your recyclables into one empty bin and see the list below of what can be recycled! Trash haulers have a 90-day transition period to implement any schedule change.

Since there is no resale market for recycled glass in Florida, and broken glass contaminates the recycling stream – glass will no longer be accepted in our recycling program. Please toss your glass in the trash bin where it will be sent to Pasco's Waste-To-Energy facility, leaving even less of a carbon footprint than it would in a landfill.

"This increase in service is a reflection of Pasco County's commitment to future sustainability and to our citizens," said Solid Waste Director John Power. "Though removing glass may seem counter-intuitive, it increases the overall reuse of collected materials, eases processing and maximizes our positive environmental impact."

YOU CAN RECYCLE:

- 1. Aluminum Cans
- 2. Cardboard
- 3. Paper
- 4. Plastic Bottles and small containers
- 5. Metal food cans

YOU CANNOT RECYCLE ITEMS LISTED BELOW:
