
Veteran's Corner

This month's Southfork Veteran is Jerry Weston who resides on Maverick.







Jerry Weston was born and raised on the family farm in Watervliet, Michigan. After he graduated from High School, he received a full scholarship at Michigan State. During the 3-day orientation, he realized that college wasn't for him. He worked in manufacturing for a couple of years building things like louvered doors and stereo cabinets. When he was 21 years old, he received his draft notice, so he chose to join the Navy, selecting a 2x4 Reserve program. He left in Sep 1965 for Boot Camp in Great Lakes, IL. Unfortunately, he ended up with double pneumonia. He was set back to a Convalescence company and was unable to graduate with his original company. He finished Boot Camp in Dec 1965 and was able to be home on leave for Christmas. Jerry then reported to San Francisco for duty onboard the Destroyer Tender, USS Markab AR23. (The ship is named after the third brightest star in the Pegasus Constellation). In Feb of 1966 the ship made the highly coveted "Westpac" deployment to Yokosuka, Japan, Subic Bay and Manilla, Philippines, Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, and Hong Kong. Unfortunately for Jerry, he didn't get to experience Hong Kong due to being on Restriction for being caught in the "Off Limits" section of town while in the Philippines! In Sep of 1966 the ship returned to California. Jerry worked in the Sheet Metal Shop working on cabinets, A/C Ducts and anything needed by the ships they supported. He left Active Duty in 1967 for a non-drilling Reserve Billet in Michigan. He was lucky enough to land a job with GM in New Product Development working on Robotics, Blueprints, etc. In 1996 he met his wife Judy through a newspaper ad (which they have framed and displayed on the wall in their home). They left Michigan in 1997, transferring to GM in Ohio where he worked for another 11 years before moving back to Michigan. Jerry and Judy came down to Florida to visit friends who lived in Harmony Heights. They soon packed up and moved to Blue Jay in 2015. In 2016 they bought the first house they looked at here at Southfork. Since they live on Maverick, they have a lovely back yard facing the neighboring fields. Judy loves to tend to her succulents and their vegetable garden. I was the lucky recipient of some wonderful Summer Squash! Thank you for your service Jerry, Hand Salute!!

All levels of yoga will be offered and I do but one at a time. Please arrive at least five (5) minutes early and easy chair yoga as you know for all around body work out.



<u>Dade City News New Signal Is Installed At U.S. 98 And U.S. 301 D.O.T.</u> Determined Signal Was Warranted At Intersection

For more years than many of us can remember, a yellow flashing light has marked the intersection of U.S. Highway 301 and U.S. Highway 98 south of Dade City.

Traffic signs alongside the north- and southbound lanes of U.S. 301 instructed motorists to lower their speed from 55 mph to 50 mph to 45 mph the closer they were to the intersection. Several property damage and personal injury accidents and a fair number of fatal accidents have occurred at the intersection over the past several years.

Now, motorists will have to pay more attention when approaching the intersection since a traffic signal was installed there on Jan. 6 by the Florida Department of Transportation.

More than 1,000 homes sit within a mile of the intersection of U.S. Highway 98 and U.S. Highway 301 just south of Dade City.

The Southfork Homeowners Association lobbied the DOT for eight years to install a traffic signal at this intersection. Many letters were written to politicians who represent the area requesting help from them. The Association's efforts finally paid off in March 2013 when the DOT notified them that recent studies confirmed a signal was warranted. The DOT said the signal would be installed "as quickly as possible - before the end of the year, if not sooner."

The DOT only missed its self-imposed deadline for installation of the new traffic signal by about a week.

DOT inspectors determined between 55 and 81 vehicles per hour made left turns at the intersection. The department also evaluated crash data from January 2009 through December 2012 and concluded that 2.5 crashes per year would be "susceptible to correction by a traffic signal – and - due to the high speed on U.S. 301 at this intersection - crashes tend to be severe."

Pasco County is upgrading to the **Alert Pasco** Notification system. If you'd like to continue receiving emergency notifications and other information that affects you and your family, please register now:

- Go to <u>egov.pascocountyfl.net/AlertPasco</u> and complete the simple sign-up process. (Please visit the *Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)* page to learn more about how Alert Pasco works.)
- To remain anonymous and receive *TEXT ONLY* emergency notifications text the word: **PASCOFL** to 888777.

All Pasco County residents are encouraged to sign up for **Alert Pasco** – Pasco's primary emergency notification system.

Hurricane Preparedness and Pets

Petswelcome.com Opens a New Window.

In the event of a hurricane, it is extremely important that pet owners have a plan in place to evacuate themselves and their pets out of harm's way. <u>Petswelcome.com</u> has launched their very own <u>Hurricane Preparedness Section Opens a New Window.</u>, which includes the People and Pet Emergency Route Planner.

The Emergency Route Planner Opens a New Window. allows pet owners to plot an evacuation route well in advance of a weather emergency, one that provides driving directions and identifies all the pet-friendly lodgings (and pet-friendly shelters as an option of last resort). The route can be saved so that it is ready to be pulled up at a moment's notice - safely before the storm hits - on the user's desktop computer, laptop, tablet, or phone, accessed at home or in the car.





Special Needs Information

The Pasco County Special Needs Program is in place to coordinate the registration, notification, and evacuation of those citizens with physical or mental disabilities or minor health and medical conditions.

Registration

Registration for the Special Needs Program can be completed through your Home Health Care Agency or Oxygen Provider, Private Care Providers, Physician's Offices, or by contacting Courtney Wildes at the Pasco County Emergency Management Office at 727-847-8137 x 2383. Once you are registered in our database, you or your healthcare representative should renew your application each and every year. Registration **does not** mean reservation in the shelter.

Notification

Evacuation notices may be made in several ways. First, we will try to call you ahead of time to let you know we are evacuating residents in your area. We will ask if you want to evacuate and if you will require transportation. Please keep in mind that this notification starts 72 or more hours prior to the arrival of bad weather. This is to ensure we have enough time to safely move citizens. Once the bad weather arrives, we will not be transporting any citizens out of their homes. Please be mindful that not everyone who is registered will be called in every emergency.

Home Health Care & Homebound Patients

Notify your health agency where you will be during a hurricane and when care can be re-established. Contact your physician if you are homebound, under the care of a physician and do not have a home health agency. Make prior medical arrangements with your physician and register in advance with your local power company if you require respirators or other electric-dependent medical equipment. Check with your supplier about emergency plans if you require oxygen. Remember to take medications, written instructions regarding your care, special equipment and bedding if you evacuate. Register now at 727-847-8137 x 2383 with Pasco County Emergency Management is you need assistance in an evacuation

Evacuation

Evacuation is coordinated with the Emergency Management office working with the School Board, Fire Rescue, and wheelchair transportation companies. When you fill out your registration, it is crucial that you indicate what mode of transportation you will require. You should be prepared to leave your house when the transportation arrives. If you plan to evacuate yourself, know ahead of time where the Special Needs Shelter is located and what route to take to get there. Make sure you bring a companion/caregiver with you, your wheelchair, walker or cane, all necessary medical supplies and prescriptions. You may also want to include any special food or nutritional supplements, a blanket, sleeping bag and pillow, complete change of clothing, personal hygiene items, and books/magazines.

The Special Needs Shelter is under the supervision of registered nurses from the Health Department and is staffed by a consulting physician, health professionals from home health care, a consulting mental health professional and volunteers. The shelter provides a safe, secure environment but doesn't take the place of hospitals, assisted living facilities, or long term care facilities.



When we get into thunderstorm situations, especially during the summer months, you may hear Spectrum Bay News 9 meteorologists use the words "watch" and "warning."

- Thunderstorm "watch" is very different from "warning"
- What makes a thunderstorm "severe"? There are criteria
- GET WARNED: <u>Have the Spectrum Bay News 9 app ready</u> when severe weather strikes in case you are without power
- WEATHER ALERTS: Sign up for our weather text alerts to get watches and warnings as they happen
- LATEST FORECAST: Satellite loops, current temperatures, county-by-county conditions

They sound similar with respect to severe thunderstorms and tornadoes, but actually, they're quite different.

When we are placed in a "watch," Spectrum Bay News 9 meteorologists will provide live updates every 10 minutes. You'll also see text scrolling at the bottom of your screen.

<u>A "watch" means conditions are favorable for severe weather or tornadoes</u>. This is when you want to make sure you have a plan in place and know where you would go in the event of a severe thunderstorm or tornado warning.

A "warning" means a severe thunderstorm or tornado is imminent or occurring, and you need to seek shelter immediately in the safest part of your home. It's best to be in the lowest level, in an interior room or closet, and away from windows and doors until the threat passes.

What makes a thunderstorm "severe"? The textbook definition of a severe thunderstorm is one that has winds of more than 58 mph, or hail 1 inch in diameter or greater, and/or a tornado. Lightning is not taken into consideration for a storm to be severe.

All thunderstorms contain lightning.

A tornado warning means that a tornado either has been observed by a trained storm spotter or detected on radar.

When you are away from your TV, the best way to stay safe is to have the <u>Spectrum Bay News 9 app</u> on your mobile device or tablet and make sure notifications are turned on. That way, you'll get notified immediately of potentially dangerous weather.
