

Hurricane Season 2021 Planning Update

The HOA Emergency Preparedness Team

As August begins, we are heading towards the peak months of hurricane season. By now, everyone has given some thought to preparing for sudden storms coming our way.

The HOA Emergency Preparedness Team has been meeting regularly. Last month we discussed resources available to everyone and urged residents to take advantage of these resources, which include the members of our dedicated volunteer Team. Please do not hesitate to contact any of us with questions, for information, or assistance. The Team continues to move forward in a number of areas. Some of these are:

1. Improved Communications Network:

At the request of the Team, and with collaboration of the ham radio group, the HOA has purchased ten (10) battery powered radios, which have been assigned to members of the Emergency Preparedness Team. The Team thanks the HOA and our Team members who have expertise in this area: David Rawson, David Hurr, Bill & Darlene Davis, and Jerry Smith. Thanks to their efforts the Team will be prepared to communicate through this system if we lose power.

2. <u>Generators (to assist those who need medication refrigerated or who rely on oxygen, etc.):</u> Last month we mentioned this as something the Team was working to put together. We have added more generators to the list. If this is something you may need, contact a Team member for more

information.

3. Zone Volunteers, Outside Items, Snowbirds:

At the recent meeting, the Team discussed these matters. Zone volunteers (see last month's issue for map and listing) keep an eye on houses within their zone. During the recent tropical storm warning there was a good response from residents in removing signs, garden furniture, or other items which might go airborne in high winds. However, there were some issues, and these will be addressed on a case-by-case basis. One issue of overall concern is the condition of snowbird homes prior to leaving. The Team has some ideas about this and will be discussing it at future meetings.

4. Special Needs Situations:

The Team continues to identify and offer to sign up those interested. If you know of someone who has special needs and requires extra help, please let us know or have the person contact one of us for assistance.

5. Volunteers Needed for Emergency Preparation Exercise:

Jerri Kaplan of Polk Emergency brought up the possibility of holding an Emergency Preparation Exercise at LHV. The Team felt we should pursue her offer. We put an article in Gator Tales last

month outlining this and asking for volunteers. To participate we need 20 – 50 people. The exercise will be at the clubhouse and is estimated to last about three hours. The details are vague, and this is part of the process. We have 13 volunteers as of July 15th. Once we identify 20+ participants we will request several possible dates from Jerri Kaplan. Hopefully, we will be able to find a convenient date for the majority. **If anyone reading this is interested, please let me or any Team member know so we can move ahead to the next step of requesting some dates.** Everyone understands that participation is contingent on obtaining an agreeable date for the exercise.

6. <u>Clubhouse Bulletin Board:</u>

The Team will be utilizing a portion of the large bulletin board in the back room / library. Watch for information of interest posted there.

All Team members are residents and volunteers working together to keep everyone safe!

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
