
Food Bank

Hurricane Season 2022: October - Month 5

Peak Season Hurricane Danger Continues

Preparation Still Important!

We are now well into hurricane season and thankfully have not experienced any serious threats yet! As we enter October we must continue to watch for possible danger from sudden hurricanes. As we know, things can change quickly. Two storms we were watching in early September, Earl & Danielle, eventually moved off and headed out to sea. Your **Emergency Preparedness Team** is monitoring the situation daily. When a serious threat is identified, the Team will meet to develop and put into effect our action plan immediately. **We will also post these updates through the LHV Facebook site.**

In the past, September and October have been the most active months for hurricanes. As always, we urge you to:

- ✓ Watch the weather on whatever TV channel or network you choose. We recommend the website https://www.nhc.noaa.gov/. This provides up to date information including charts and graphs that are easily accessible and easy to understand.
- ✓ Do not panic! This is important. Listen closely and evaluate the situation. Watch the Team's response. If you are unsure or have a question, contact a Team member.
- ✓ Everyone received a Zone Map that can be used as a reference and for those Team members near you who can answer questions or help.
- ✓ Be sure you have supplies available. The Polk County Emergency Operations Center recommends that you prepare a '7 Day Emergency Kit' in case electricity goes out by purchasing batteries, water, non-perishable items and other necessities. If you have not begun, do not delay any longer!
- ✓ See the hurricane shelter map (distributed to all residents) and other information provided by the Team for further guidance.
- ✓ Think about what you would do if a hurricane was headed our way tonight! Would you evacuate? Where? Are you equipped to stay? What about pets? Lots of things to think about better to think about them now not when a hurricane has us in its sights!
- ✓ Keep an eye out for your neighbors. Do any need help?
- ✓ If any questions contact one of our Team members

The fellow in the picture below figured he would wait to purchase batteries, water, canned goods, and other things, and start putting together a 7 day emergency kit. This is what he found! A nosey neighbor heard him exclaim:

"Yikes! This is the third store I've been to. No batteries, no water, almost no canned goods, and gas stations are all out of gas for my car. Maybe I should have listened to those annoying Emergency Team people who keep saying prepare, prepare, prepare! What am I going to do now? I should have planned things better!"



Not a good situation! Don't let yourself fall into this by procrastinating! Don't wait. Take action now!
