Hurricane Season Winding Down

Hurricane Danger Continues Through November! Preparation Still Important!

Every month the Emergency Preparedness Team tries to present a timely article with the focus on preparing for hurricane emergencies. **Gator Tales** and its Editors, Shelly Shaffer & Joyce Middleton, have been terrific, supporting the Team with LOTS of space to present information. The Team appreciates this support and the time consuming, and painstaking job of putting together this wonderful publication each month. I, along with most of those I know, look forward to each issue with great anticipation.

Many of you may not be aware that **Gator Tales** has a submission deadline of the 20th of the month for the next issue. This provides time for editing, putting it together, and having the final product printed, and then delivered around the first of the month. The deadline for the October issue was September 20th, and the Team submitted its article at that time. So far, so good you may say, what's the problem? Let me quote the first part of the <u>October article</u> and the problem should be obvious:

"We are now well into hurricane season and thankfully have not experienced any threats yet! As we enter October we must continue to watch for possible sudden hurricanes. As we know, things can change quickly. Two watching in early September, Earl & Danielle, eventually headed out to sea."

All that was true.......at the time it was submitted! The Team tries to anticipate things for the upcoming month. However, in this situation, between the date of submission and date of publication, things changed drastically as we all know! **Hurricane Ian** headed our way! The Team met twice to develop and implement a plan. Cooperation from residents was great. The Team also worked with Phil Nespeca to develop a list of those leaving and remaining, which was provided to the Police Department for safety checks. We believe that the Team's efforts increased awareness and that the information and assistance provided was helpful to some of our residents.

It seems that our residents weathered the storm fairly well. We give thanks that nobody suffered serious injury. There was some damage to homes, but it appears to be much less than in Hurricane Irma. Phil & Management moved quickly to remove tree limbs and other debris and this prompt action was appreciated by all of us.

We are very proud of how Team members and others throughout LHV responded quickly and efficiently to the first serious hurricane threat since Irma in 2017. Due to this experience, we have all learned many things – lessons learned, so to speak. By the time you see this article the Team will have met to discuss these issues, assess our response, and consider these matters in our future planning.

November Space Coast Launch Forecast

Note:

Once again the launches are coming at the rate of almost one per week or two, with many being scheduled with little (5-7 days) notice. Updates will be posted to our Launch Alert Facebook page on an as known basis.

NASA SLS - 11/14 12:07am

The often delayed maiden flight of the new Space Launch System (SLS) rocket and Orion spacecraft has been tentatively been re-scheduled for just after midnight on the 14th. The flight will take off from launch complex 39B, which has not hosted a launch since October, 2009, and it is the most Northerly pad on the space coast. If it is clear, look to the NE and you should have no problem seeing this launch. The SLS will launch the Orion spacecraft around the moon with a splashdown in the Pacific two weeks later.


Space-X - 11/18 TBD

A Falcon 9 rocket will launch a Dragon 2 cargo capsule to the International Space Station for NASA on it's CRS-26 mission this month, launch time should be around 4-5pm.

Space-X - TBD

Space—X is planning on launching at least 3 other Falcon 9 rockets in this time period carrying several communication satellites, along with its own Star link internet satellites. This will, be a very busy month.
