



# Now is The Time to Plan

The 'Hurricane Clock' is ticking. We are already heading into Month Two of Hurricane Season. Historically, peak season comes later, usually between August and October. However, dealing with Mother Nature, anything is possible – as we learned last year when we had a November storm.

So, as we enter Month Two, we ask residents: **ARE YOU READY IF A STORM CAME YOUR WAY TOMORROW?**

The answer for most of us is **NO!** We all need to think about this and start to take things seriously. We cannot control the weather, but there are things we can do to prepare for hurricane season and **NOW** is the time you should be planning for the inevitable storm. There is help available to you if you want it. **The HOA Emergency Preparedness Team** is available to help. Just ask any Team Member. The goals of the Team are **to help each other, to keep our residents safe, and to try to assist everyone to be better prepared in times of hurricane or other emergencies.** Remember, Team members are all residents and volunteers, and we can all work together to keep each other safe!

On June 1<sup>st</sup> the HOA Emergency Preparedness Team held its **Second Annual Hurricane Preparedness Open House** event at the Clubhouse. The Team gathered a tremendous amount of hurricane related information for residents. Everyone who attended received a comprehensive '**Hurricane Information Packet.**' The event was publicized and promoted. Four organizations were present to provide assistance or answer questions. Jerri Kaplan of the Polk County Emergency Management office gave a great presentation with a video. Many Team Members were present. A lunch was provided by the HOA.

**Yet only 54 residents attended! Many of these were husband & wife couples, and many were Team members. We appreciate and thank everyone who was there.**

Those who attended were very pleased with the opportunity to obtain information and hear from knowledgeable speakers. We understand that our '**Snowbirds**' are not here. Others were away on vacation. Some do not wish to be bothered at all. Others feel they don't need help and plan to do things alone. Some do not worry about the weather until a hurricane is coming and plan to deal with it then. There are many reasons for the low turnout. However, there are still lots of residents who could have benefitted from the information provided. For those residents who did not attend, you missed a good opportunity.

The Emergency Preparedness Team is a resource for you. We provide information and support. You make your own decisions. We understand that some choose to do things on their own. That is their choice. The Team met on June 15<sup>th</sup> and continues to meet monthly. The Team will be distributing '**Hurricane Information Packets**' to residents who are here but did not attend the June 1 event.

In last month's **Gator Tales**, we included a **Zone Map**. As most of you know, the Team has broken LHV up into eight zones for the purpose of hurricane planning. The idea is that each Zone will have at least two volunteers to work in that zone. For this plan to work properly, we must have enough volunteers. At present we have a number of dedicated individuals in each zone but need more help in this area. At present, our volunteers are able to answer questions and provide information. Remember, many are also involved in other activities at LHV, and there are time constraints to consider. In short, their time is limited. So, we will do our best to help but need more people in each zone.

According to Team Coordinator Dave Graham, "Since the Open House I haven't had any calls for information or any new volunteers. We have provided information packets to the **Welcome Committee** for new residents. Hopefully, by the end of June, all residents will have received '**Hurricane Information Packets**.' I hope everyone will continue preparing for hurricane season. There are resources available, and it is up to each person to take advantage if they wish. The Team is there for those who need it. We will continue our reminders in our monthly Gator Tales article and through our clubhouse Bulletin Board. We will also post information on Facebook as time goes on."

The Team thanks LHV Manager Phil Nespeca for his assistance in copying hundreds of flyers and documents for our '**Hurricane Information Packets**.' We appreciate this very much. We also thank the HOA for its ongoing support, and our thanks to all of you who helped make our Open House a success!
