Message From the President.....

We are entering the busiest time of the year...the Holidays and your HOA, your Activities Committee and the LHV Social Committee have many wonderful events planned. Starting off with the Annual Yard Sale on November 4, followed by our Veteran's Day Celebration on November 10, our Fall Social on November 18 and, of course, Thanksgiving on November 23. Signup sheets are available for all events at the clubhouse. Before I go any further, let me apologize to all of our retired Marines for scheduling our Veteran's Day Celebration on the Marine Corps Birthday. As it turns out, we had originally scheduled the yard sale for November 11, and had scheduled the Veteran's Day Celebration for the 10th. Realizing this might be too difficult and hectic for both events, we moved the yard sale to the 4th, failing to recognize the 10th as the Marine Corps Birthday. Once again, I apologize for this mistake. I also want to thank Debbie Evilsizer for stepping up to coordinate Thanksgiving. This is her first effort at coordinating an event, so if you are able, please offer to assist her with whatever she needs.

Changing gears...remember, we are actively seeking nominations for the Board of Directors. Currently, we have 6 active members with this year being the last for 2 of them, leaving 4 members (we need 7 to be fully staffed). These 4 members will be in the last year of their term in 2024. Let me remind you, as an HOA, we need a minimum of 4 members in order to stay active. Without those 4 members, our HOA becomes inactive. When that happens, all monies held in our account(s) become frozen, which means there will be **no funding for anything**. We currently pay \$65/year to keep our HOA active, but if the HOA ever becomes inactive, it will cost \$650+ to be reinstated. So, if you think you might have some new ideas and can improve on the direction of your HOA, please consider running for the BOD's. I encourage both full time residents, as well as, seasonal residents to "throw their hat into the ring".

Finally, with Christmas right around the corner, we will have many exciting events designed to get you in the Christmas spirit, including a Golf Cart Parade and home decorating contest. I encourage you to attend the Activities Committee Meeting on November 7 and/or the HOA Meeting on November 14 to stay informed.

Watch out for November Surprises!

As of November 1st there are only **four weeks remaining in Hurricane Season**. Though November storms have been rare in the past, they are still a substantial threat. Late season storms seem to be occurring more often. Remember that in 2022 **Hurricane Ian arrived on September 28th**, and then **on November 10, 2022 Hurricane Nicole** made landfall. Seeing a hurricane so late in the season was unusual but should be a lesson to all of us. Our Team recommends that you:

- * Stay alert – watch weather forecasts for possible storm danger
- * Keep your hurricane supplies handy. Don't put them away just yet!
- * Watch for Team Alerts on the LHV Facebook Page
- * Utilize the information the Team has provided
- * Think about what choices you should make if a hurricane threatens us.
- * Contact a Team member if any questions (see list below)

To our returning Snowbirds:

We missed you and are happy you are back! The Team has hurricane information for you if you would like it. Just ask a Team member. It is not too late to be prepared.

To our New Residents: We welcome you to LHV, a very special place! We encourage you to attend the New Resident Monthly Meeting. **If you do, you will receive Hurricane Information.** If you have not attended but need hurricane information, contact one of us and we will get you a Hurricane Information Packet.

The Team met on October 19th for its regularly scheduled monthly meeting and will meet again on November 16th. If a storm approaches, the Team will meet in a special session and implement its plans.

As we mentioned, anything can happen, and the unexpected often does! In this time of changing weather patterns and unusual activity we need to be vigilant and be prepared as this can still be a very dangerous time of year!

The Team thanks the HOA for its ongoing support.

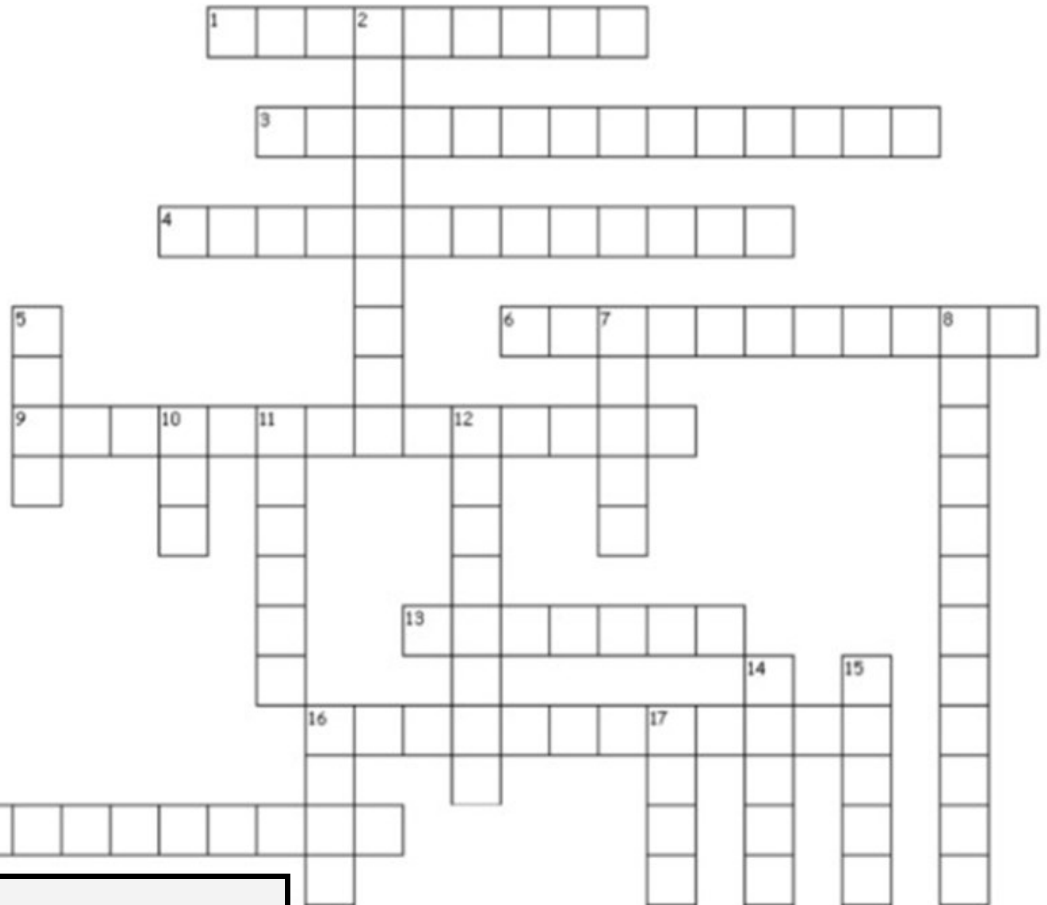
