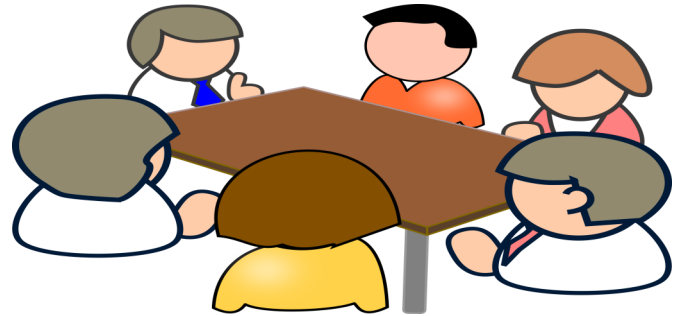

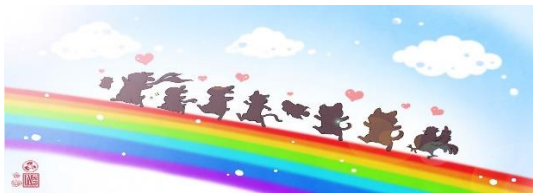

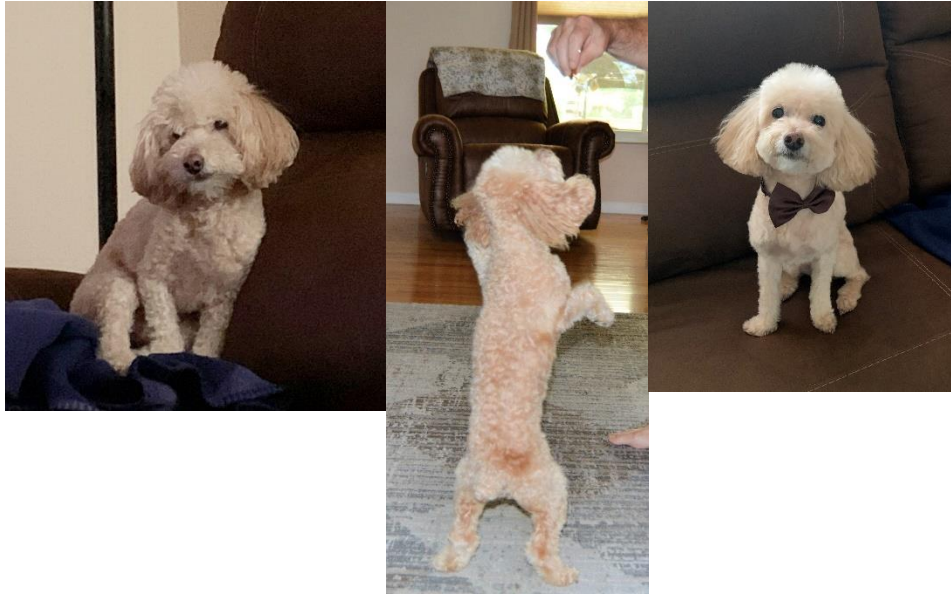
Judy has 2 children which both have passed.

## Preparing for Hurricane Season 2024:

### AUGUST - MONTH THREE

#### Time to Get Serious about

#### Hurricane Planning:

### Peak Season is Coming – Be Prepared!

It is hard to believe, but the first third of hurricane season is over, but four more months of danger remain! As we enter **Month Three** and **move into Peak Season**, **it is time to take whatever steps are necessary to protect yourself from the near certainty that we will see some bad storms coming our way soon.**

Everyone has received the information the Team has provided. As we suggested last month, **please take some time to look over this information and think about what choices you would make when a hurricane threatens us.** Unlike minor decisions which we make every day, our decisions regarding hurricane preparation affect our health and safety. So, it is important to take a close look at this and plan accordingly. Last August the Team listed recommendations in its monthly article and again recommends the following:

Before a hurricane threatens you, consider these suggestions:

- \* Realize that you will probably have two or three days to make important decisions. This is better than a tornado which has zero notice! You will have some time. Be sure to use it well!
- \* **When a 'Hurricane Watch' is issued, this means a storm is expected within 48 hours.**
- \* At that time our Team will schedule a Special / Emergency Meeting and post signs for all to attend if interested – also will be posted on Facebook.
- \* The time to **'start thinking about things'** is **now** – before the storm arrives!
- \* Now is the time to stock up on supplies, such as water, batteries, peanut butter, tuna fish, and other non-perishables. These disappear quickly from store shelves when a storm is forecasted.
- \* Everyone should **have a Plan** for when a storm is coming – and history tells us that this will come at some point during the season.
- \* You have received a Shelter Map. Look at it! If all else fails, you can go to a public shelter.
- \* To get started – try to identify what you would do. Do you plan to stay with family or friends? **Remember that family and friends are also dealing with the same hurricane situation! They may mean well, but conditions may prevent them from getting to you. Traffic on I-4, Route 27, and most Florida highways is slow, unreliable, and unpredictable, and can be a disaster in itself!**
- \* **Don't rely on others! YOU ARE ULTIMATELY RESPONSIBLE FOR YOUR OWN SAFETY!**
- \* Have a plan! And consider a backup plan too!
- \* Do you plan to 'stay and ride it out' on your own? If so, make sure you have food supplies and that **all your outdoor decorations (flags, lights, statues, etc.) are removed or tied down for the protection of you and your neighbors. Be a good neighbor and take care of this.**
- \* **REMEMBER:** Once you decide to stay and the hurricane hits, you will not be able to leave, and no police or others will come during the storm! So.....when you decide, be sure to understand that you will not be able to leave until the storm is over – and be prepared for this.
- \* Do you plan to leave for a more secure location, such as a hotel?
- \* See the **Hurricane Evacuation Planning Guide** which was put together by **Team Member David Rawson** in this issue of Gator Tales
- \* **NOW is the time to look into these things! Don't procrastinate!**
- \* If you have a pet, most hotels charge a **Pet Fee**, and many do not allow pets.
- \* For informational purposes, the Team had put together a **Hotel List 2022**. Due to lack of volunteers this has not been updated for 2024. This is a huge undertaking and something the Team would

like to update if there are volunteers interested in working on this. The 2022 list is available as a reference and may be helpful in current form. **One consideration when contacting hotels is to be sure to ask if they have a generator. Many smaller hotels do not, which means you will have no electrical service during outages but may be in a very safe building. This is very important so be sure to ask this! Larger hotels and hotel chains have generators.** For an e-mail copy, contact a Team Member or the Team Coordinator below.

#### **Bottom Line Recommendations:**

1. Be ready for anything that might happen
2. Think about things in advance
3. If you have questions, contact a Team Member

#### **Team Notes:**

- \* Keep an eye on the weather. An excellent source is the National Hurricane Center at **<https://www.nhc.noaa.gov>**
- \* The Team meets monthly or as needed when weather threatens. All are welcome.
- \* The Team is offering the **Generator Assistance Program** again this year. **Many residents use medications which must be kept cool or refrigerated. In times of power outages this is a big problem. The Team has identified a number of very generous individuals who own generators and are willing to share them to help those in need.** They may also help to **store food during power outages, help residents to charge cell phones and other items, etc.** If you have a need or want more information, contact your Zone Representative or the Team Coordinator. The Team is very proud of all the generous owners who have agreed to help fellow residents.
- \* The Team welcomes anyone interested in joining. Just contact any of our members for more information.
- \* The Team thanks the HOA for its continued support.

### **Hurricane Evacuation Planning Guide**

#### **Items to Load for Evacuation to Shelter:**

- Emergency food and water supply
- Emergency medicine supply
- Emergency power sources such as flashlights (don't forget extra batteries)
- Safety and personal items
- Important documents, including medical documents, wills, passports, and personal identification
- A fire extinguisher
- Map to shelter

#### **Further Recommendations:**

- **Map to shelter:**  
Test drive to shelter to familiarize yourself with route. If you have GPS pre-load address
- **Collect and position Emergency food and water supply:**  
Locate for easy access
- **Collect and position Emergency Medicine:**  
Set in small bag for easy access
- **Collect and position Emergency power sources (batteries & flashlights):**  
Check flashlight and battery status

- **Collect and position Safety and Personal Items:**  
Toiletries and items in easy to grab bags
- **Collect documents, including Medical, wills, passports:**  
Copies and originals in waterproof envelope
- **Collect Tools to shut off water, gas, and electricity:**  
Check condition and position tools
- **Check fire extinguisher for status:**  
Check expiration dates and gauge



## Potential Hurricane Watch Meeting

The Emergency Preparedness Team has recommended that if the National Hurricane Center issues a Hurricane Watch for our area we will meet that night at the clubhouse to discuss options and gauge how many of our residents are planning on either staying or leaving. With hurricane IAN, the HC police were asking for a list. If a watch is issued the attached signs (3) will be placed around LHV and we will convene at 6:30pm. If you have any questions see your zone leader.

## New Scams & Shams

A couple of things to watch out for have popped-up on our radar. I want to make sure they're on your radar as well.

The first one has to do with fake text messages from Florida Sun Pass. These text messages generally tell the receiver that their vehicle has unpaid tolls, and they need to go to the Sun Pass website to clear the matter. However the website the text gives you is not the real Sun Pass website – it may look legitimate, but if you click on the link you would be opening yourself up to some major problems. The scam is categorized as a phishing scam which is designed to capture personal information from your phone.

Always be cautious about mail, email, and texts that instruct you to go to a particular website. Make sure the website you are going to are the real deal, and not some impostor.

Another thing to watch for is shady solar panel salespeople. Not all door-to-door salespeople are looking to rip you off, but some are, so keep your guard up. Attorney General Ashley Moody recommends that when you're hearing a solicitation at your home, take a photo of the home solicitation permit and photo identification of the salesperson. Also be aware of high pressure sales tactics.

Research the company before signing any contracts or exchanging any money. Look for online reviews of the company/contractor, and ask friends or family if they have any dealings with the entity.

Obviously, this goes for not only solar panel installations, but any kind of work for hire at your home or business.

Please share this information with your friends and family, especially if they are elderly. A lot of scammers like to target the older members of our community.

If you suspect a scammer has contacted you, report it to the Attorney General's Fraud Hotline at 1-800-9NO-SCAM.

If you are a victim of a scam, report it to the Polk County Sheriff's office at 863-298-6200.

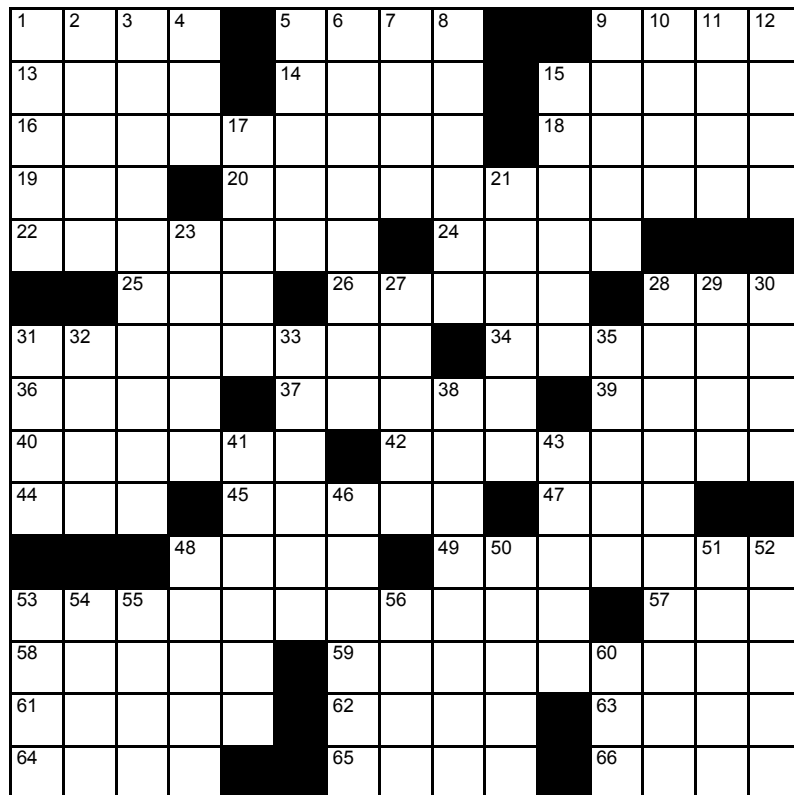
